The Pier 45 Fish Processing Facility

Background

Located in one of the oldest neighborhoods in San Francisco, Fisherman's Wharf is a popular tourist destination and a San Francisco icon. The Port of San Francisco has been engaged in a multi-year effort to upgrade infrastructure in this neighborhood, with a specific focus on improvements that yield environmental and economic benefits.

The project includes installation of a pumpout manifold that would allow herring boats moored along the west apron of the Pier 45 Fish Processing Facility to discharge fish waste to the City sewer system. In addition, a new stormwater collection system will be installed along the west apron of Pier 45 to direct polluted stormwater runoff from this area back to the City's sewer system.

Status

Design and permitting for this project were completed in 2008. The project was put out to bid for construction in June 2009. Port staff anticipate awarding the construction contract in July 2009, and mobilizing for construction in September 2009. Construction will be complete in March 2010.

Benefits

Jobs Created: 20 jobs would be created over the term of construction. The proposed improvements would also support 100 existing jobs at the Pier 45 Fish Processing Facility.

Environmental Benefits: The project will reduce bacterial loadings in the vicinity of Aquatic Park, a nearby swimming beach, and will help ensure regulatory compliance for fish processing facilities at Pier 45.
