<b>Award Description</b> Solar America Cities Special Projects On October 8, 2009, the Department of Energy announced \$10M through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act for 40 new Solar America Cities Special Projects in 16 cities. This funding will enable the cities to increase solar energy use in their communities through innovative programs and policies that can then be replicated across the nation.  In 2007 and 2008, DOE launched partnerships with 25 large U.S. Cities to develop comprehensive, city-wide approaches to accelerating solar energy adoption. The results to date have been impressive; these Solar America Cities have developed groundbreaking solar financing models, streamlined solar	

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permitting processes, and created training courses for solar installers, among many other accomplishments. This new Recovery Act funding will enable 16 cities to scale up their most promising projects and concepts to overcome key barriers to urban solar energy use. DOE will then share the lessons learned and best practices from these projects with local governments throughout the nation through a substantial outreach effort planned to launch in early 2010.
